The Eastman Judged Art Exhibition for 2013 has been awarded to Pinawa with Pinawa Art 211 taking the organizational reins. This is the fifth time Pinawa has held the exhibit since 1983 and celebrates its 50th anniversary in 2013. What better way to honour this event and support the visual arts in our region than by displaying your works in the Pinawa Community Centre.

The entry fee is set at \$15 for your first entry, \$10 for the second entry and \$5.00 if you have a third piece for the judges' consideration. Each item on display will be critiqued by a professional artist from the Manitoba Arts Council. Categories for the Eastman Judged Art Exhibition will include: Visual Arts (painting, print making, mixed media and photography), Fibre Arts, Sculpture and Pottery, and Jewellery. Each category will be eligible for 1st, 2nd or 3rd place award, with a "People's Choice" award presented on the final day of the exhibition. Pinawa Art 211 will host workshops, school tours and a special Opening Ceremony, Awards Presentation and Reception for the artists, dignitaries and other invited guests. LAC DU BONNET LIBRARY NEWS

On December 18, Provencher MP Vic Toews visited the Lac du Bonnet Library bearing a much appreciated gift. The Library received funding of \$5,617.00 from the Community Infrastructure Improvement program so they can fix up the ceiling and paint the entire space. A group of supporters and patrons attended to celebrate the announcement, including local MLA Wayne Ewasko, LDB Mayor Greg Short, board secretary Cathie Brereton, head librarian Vicki Short, and other library staff. Coffee and snacks were served to the crowd after the dignitaries spoke. During the brief speeches, Vicky Short noted how grateful the library was to receive these additional funds which will allow the library to better serve the community. Board Secretary welcomed the crowd and the politicians, reminding everyone how important the library is to the community and explaining how she and her husband were "bookoholics" who relied on the library to entertain and instruct them on a regular basis.

MEMBER NEWS - WRAC ART CLASSES

After two Pinawa residents expressed an interest in a drawing class, local artist Mary Louise Chown, based in River Hills, agreed to run a class for up to 8 students. Mary Louise, BA, BEd, BFA, is a qualified art instructor with years of art instruction experience. The classes begin in late January or early February, 1:00pm -3:30 PM (day TBA). The 10 sessions will be held in Pinawa (location TBA). Cost per student \$80 plus basic drawing supplies suggested by the instructor.

Course Content - Introduction to Drawing: Another way to express yourself!

Age is no barrier for learning to draw. Anyone can learn, if taught some very basic skills. Students will explore interesting subjects and develop an understanding of composition, form, light and shadow. Drawing skills will enhance your painting or photography, or if you have never made any art before, drawing will bring appreciation for the environment, stress reduction, and a calming meditative experience.

RURAL YOUTH MENTORSHIP PROGRAM 2013

Once again, ACI (Creative Manitoba) has asked that WRAC and the Eastman region be included in their Rural Youth Mentorship Program. This year, the mentor will be Anita Drabyk from Pinawa, a photographer, editor, writer, and visual artist. Two Pinawa youth will be mentored in hopes they will become professional photographers. The students will be meeting and working with Anita from January until May, learning as much as possible from her about the art of photography.

Ukrainian History, Dance and Song Featured in Lac du Bonnet Historical Society's Wine and Cheese Fundraiser

On December 7th, 2013, a capacity crowd filled the Lac du Bonnet Community Centre to enjoy a special event called "Brightstone –Our Ukrainian Heritage" organized by the LdB Historical Society. President Kathy Willis welcomed everyone and encouraged people to check out the displays which featured pictures, documents, and writings about Brightstone pioneers. Also displayed were baskets of pysanky, the intricately decorated Ukrainian Easter eggs. Tracy Rossier, a local artist/instructor, explained her love of pysanky and told about the history and art of these eggs.

Rosemary Todaschuk, and her sister Charlene who had just arrived from Montreal, dressed in traditional costumes, sang well-known Ukrainian songs and Christmas favourites. During the intermission, the audience enjoyed a spread of garlic sausage, vegetables, smoked fish, and other delicacies, and sampled various wines and Ukrainian beer. After a short speech by Wally Stoyko, a teacher who taught at Brightstone in 1949, the lively Mohutniy Ensemble, also in traditional costumes, performed a series of dances, with the requisite kicks, jumps, spins, and other difficult moves. The evening concluded with draws from a huge silent auction.

ACI MANITOBA ANNOUNCES NEW AMYC COURSE – TUESDAYS, FEBRUARY 5, 2013 TO APRIL 30, 2013

If you are a self-employed artist with an existing arts practice and you'd like to improve your business, promotion, marketing, communication and financial skills, this course, "The Art of Managing Your Career," is for you! For several years, ACI Manitoba has offered the series of classes to over 150 artists of all kinds, to help them learn how to support themselves with their art. The instructor, Heather Bishop toured as a singer/songwriter for decades, received an Order of Canada for her humanitarian work, taught women in trades, and instructed musicians in piano, voice, and guitar. DECEMBER FEATURED ARTIST

For December, Winnipeg River Arts Council featured Pinawa artist/author, **Brenda McKenzie**. After a Christmas gift of a paint-by-number kit sparked her interest in painting, McKenzie's Grade 9 art teacher, John Eisler, encouraged her to take youth classes at Winnipeg Art Gallery. Later, she enrolled in University of Manitoba's Faculty of Interior Design, where she learned about design, composition, value work, and colour, under the tutelage of Grant Marshall and Harry Adaskin.

In 1971, newly married, McKenzie arrived in Pinawa, took art lessons with Vivian Thomson, and learned water colour and oil painting techniques. Presently, her repertoire also includes graphite work, pen and ink, and mixed media - using inks, coloured pencil and water-based media. When Thomson retired from the Whiteshell School District, McKenzie replaced her in the school's art program.

Five decades after that first kit, McKenzie continues to produce landscapes but recent creations include portraits and still life. She sells her work at Eastern Manitoba Artists' Collective and Pinawa Art 211 shows. It is displayed at the Cre8ery Gallery (Winnipeg) and Gwen Fox Gallery (Selkirk). The Parish of St. Francis (Pinawa) commissioned her to do a painting of their new church, displayed at Sobering Funeral Chapel (Beausejour). Recently, she illustrated a local author's cookbook and has started pencil drawings for a book on World War II London.

After Mckenzie retired in 2004, she wrote a novel, <u>Loving You</u>, based on her family's experience of Alzheimer's disease and the resulting three year wait for her mother-in-law's placement. The book can be purchased at "Uniquely Pinawa" (Pinawa), Ingham's Pharmacy (Lac du Bonnet), Pharmasave (Beausejour), Blaines Books, Movies and Music Store (Selkirk Plaza Mall), and McNally Robinson and Coles in Kildonan Place and City Centre (Winnipeg).

Recently, McKenzie volunteered to coordinate the 2013 Eastman Judged Art Exhibition. This event will be hosted by Pinawa Art 211 at the Pinawa Community Centre, June 12-15, 2013, and will showcase hundreds of artistic entries from throughout the Eastman region. 

January Featured WRAC Artist

Meet featured artist Mary Louise Chown, a visual artist, storyteller, and musician who recently moved with her husband to a farm just outside River Hills. Delighted to discover a large arts community in the North Eastman area, she has already participated in a successful storytelling concert held in Pinawa last November and sponsored by WRAC.

Although born in Toronto, Chown considers herself a prairie chicken, having lived most of her life in Winnipeg. She heard many stories in her own extended family, and is most familiar with the folktales of the British Isles and Northern Europe. Chown also plays hammered dulcimer, guitar and percussion with "The Fine Companions" folk music band. She often includes music and song in her stories, inviting audiences of all ages to participate.

Chown has performed at storytelling festivals in Toronto, Ottawa, Whitehorse, Edmonton, Vancouver, the Winnipeg Folk
Festival, and the Winnipeg International Children's Festivals. She also has worked with the Manitoba Arts Council as a visiting
artist in schools across Manitoba. Her week-long residencies paired storytelling with art making for students of all ages. She
designed a storytelling and music concert series called "The Magic of One", which had a successful six year run in Winnipeg.
Her video installation "The Skin of This Planet" was recently exhibited at the University of Winnipeg Art Gallery and at St.
Boniface Hospital and won an award from ArtWorks in Edmonton, Alberta. Her paintings and prints have been exhibited at group
and juried shows in Winnipeg, Ottawa, the Internet, and Barcelona, Spain.

Gathering people together to share their stories is an important part of her work and has taken her into group homes for young offenders, adult survivor groups, classes for seniors and more recently, as a visiting artist in Winnipeg hospitals, telling stories, listening to stories and playing music. She has been invited to talk about this work so often that she finally wrote and published her first book about her experiences in healthcare. The book, titled NOW I KNOW THE WORLD IS ROUND: Stories At the End of Life, has gone into second printing, and is available at McNally Robinson Booksellers, or from Chown directly.

This program may apply to your organization! Projects must involve an established professional artist (or artists) and must provide a meaningful artistic experience for the Manitoban community. Communities could include remote, rural, persons with disabilities, youth, at-risk, northern, or others. If your organization can't figure out a program for this deadline, you might want to think about an idea for next year. The Manitoba Arts Council wants to spread their resources to new communities and supply funding to organizations outside of Winnipeg.

For February, Winnipeg River Arts Council features **Anita Schewe Drabyk**, who lives in Pinawa but grew up on a farm near Beausejour where her interest in art, nature and agriculture was nurtured and where making your own art cards was the norm. A great aunt treated her and her sister with various art supplies and encouraged their love of art. Drabyk's interests, education and career in biology influence her art; flowers, plants, mammals, birds and the natural landscape are dominant themes in her work.

Drabyk enjoys photography, watercolours and various other painting media. Her art has incorporated the advice and expertise of photographers and painters from across Canada. Her work was particularly influenced by Courtney Milne, a photographer from Saskatchewan. Drabyk was chair of two artistic groups, Pinawa Art 211 and of Pinawa Association for Photographic Art, for many years. Here she enjoyed the company and peer review of many talented artists and photographers.

Drabyk lived in China for two years and visited the country a few more times and these sojourns have modified how she looks at art and photography. Here again she enjoyed viewing and interpreting rural life, gardens, birds and the physical landscape. In China, she also taught art for the local Canadian students.

In the 2012 Art in the Forest project at Sandilands Provincial Forest, her work, "A Walk in the Forest", depicted different aspects of forests: the small, the large, the real, and the spiritual. For March, WRAC featured Lac du Bonnet Regional Library.

In 1977, a group of dedicated supporters campaigned for a library in the area. In 1980, after three years as a volunteer-run organization with materials donated or block borrowed from travelling libraries, it was designated "Provincial Regional." At first, it moved around, from the former Northern Store to a room in the old Park Avenue School. On April 1, 1981, it opened its doors at 70 Park Street in Suite #1, with its first paid librarian, Barbara Steed. As time passed and holdings increased, it expanded into a second suite, under the direction of Maureen Flemming. In October of 1989, after the board decided to build a custom designed facility, volunteers spearheaded fundraising and building plans. The next January, on a bitterly cold day, they packed up and moved everything to the current location at 84 Third Street.

In 1997, the next librarian, Roz Burt, introduced automated software. After her departure, Kathy Derksen and Lynn Carter took as Head Librarians and current Head Librarian, Vickie Short, took over in 2007. As technology moves forward so does the library, incorporating online membership account access, downloadable eBooks/audiobooks, travel databases, online Consumer Reports and EDSCOhost, an online access database.

For twenty-one years now, the library has catered to young and old, providing favorite books, movies, reference material, audios, large print, magazines and numerous other items. Also, it has hosted guest authors, held pajama and game nights, and run the ever successful kids' Summer Reading programs. During the last five years, the library has replaced shingles, repaired and painted the ceiling, and integrated ongoing computer upgrades. Visit www.lacdubonnetlibrary.ca

WRAC FEATURED ARTIST FOR APRIL: JIM NIEDERMAYER

Jim Niedermayer, from the Powerview area, loves to create art from logs. He took up chainsaw carving in 2009, after Pine Falls paper mill shut down. When he won first place in a 2013 competition in The Pas, the *Opasquia Times* interviewed him. He noted, "I had the opportunity to buy all the big wood that was available. Instead of having that wood destined to make paper, I decided to try and make something out of it."

Niedermayer learned how to carve on his own and still has his first bear to remind himself of progress. His father, a knife maker and woodcarver, had given him a book on the subject so he worked at it for about six months. But he already knew how to handle a chainsaw. As a harvester of wild rice from remote lakes, he learned how to make lumber on the spot, ripping logs into boards freehand. In 2010, Niedermayer travelled to a Pennsylvania rendezvous. Despite his apprehensions about not being "good enough," the other participants were surprised he had just started. He explains that his carvings look like caricatures. Although he works hard to get them to look more realistic and even studies anatomy, chainsaws tear into wood quickly, requiring great control to avoid slip-ups. Before he starts, he traces a rough design on the block of wood with chalk or felt marker. In competitions, carvers work non-stop. As Niedermayer said in his Pas interview, manipulating a chainsaw for four hours "is not an easy thing to do." He uses full safety gear - pants, glasses, ear protection, steel toe boots, gloves, and respirator mask.

All wood is salvaged and he prefers birch, highland spruce, cottonwood, and pine. He especially likes pine that has been submerged in water and he often drags big logs out of lakes. He uses three saws, ranging in size from 24" bar to 16" bar for fine details and paints his carvings with Sikens Oil to protect them. He creates bears, eagles, herons, otters, and other wild animals but also gets many requests for tiki bar creatures. Although he sells his carving mostly through word of mouth, he has a website: **chainsawsculpture.ca** where customers can view his work.

For the month of May, Winnipeg River Arts Council featured an artist who works with glass, Claudia Chomichuk. Her fascination started as a casual hobby more than thirty years ago. One winter, after taking a stained glass evening course she decided to create a large leaded window panel for her house. She set up a small studio space in her basement and continued to experiment with stained glass whenever she had spare time. When she retired from teaching, she and her husband moved from Winnipeg to their cottage at Hillside Beach in the Rural Municipality of Alexander. The cottage required extensive renovations to convert it to a full-time residence, which created a unique opportunity for Claudia to design her own studio space and spend more time on her designs. Her studio, Purple Pelican Art Glass Studio, occupies the second level of their home. It is here that she hosts a public Open House every two years - and opens her studio to visitors by appointment at other times.

Chomichuk never passes up an opportunity to take classes to upgrade her skills - both in Winnipeg and in Arizona where she spends her winters. Her repertoire now includes fused glass as well. Her work incorporates a full range of styles and techniques: traditional stained glass, three-dimensional leaded glass, fused glass bowls and panels, glass mosaics and creations that contain combinations of these techniques. Her original designs are inspired by her love of her natural world. Lake Winnipeg is prominent in her life and its influence can be seen in many of her works. She spent her childhood on the west shore of the lake and now resides on the east shore. The aspen and pine forests that surround her residence and the flower gardens that she nurtures also influence her work. Her work is sold from her own studio, a local gift shop (Carol's on Leon) and three galleries in Winnipeg (Pulse, Glitz, and Fleet). She does commission work as well. Eligibility Information

Who is Eliqible to Apply?

Individual artists (singers, musicians, troupes, component, writers, dancers, artists, actors, etc.) and not for profit art organizations from Mandoba are eligible to apply for the Fine & Water Arts Award. Presions award incipients are eligible if prior awards are in good standing and if project Final Reports have been completed and submitted.

What can I apply for?

The Fire & Water Arts Award wants to make at happen in Lac du Bonnet, the region and the province. Projects to make art happen now (in the next 12 months) and projects that will enhance an organizations ability to make even more art happen in the future will be considered. The Fire & Water Arts Award directs his support to one time projects and does not fund capital expenses or operating costs. No more than one (1) application per individual / organization will be accepted in each award count.

What size award may I apply for?





For June, the Winnipeg River Arts Council features Pinawa visual artist, Valerie Ross. In September 2005, Ross stood on a dock in Pinawa looking out at the river. In that moment she knew where she was meant to be. Eventually her husband, Alex, was drawn into the possibility of one last adventure. In May of 2006, they left 63 years of living in Southern Ontario to immerse themselves in Pinawa's pristine beauty.

Local residents often spotted Ross, with camera in hand, taking pictures of the nature and wildlife. She sent many e-mails and photos to family and friends describing excitedly all there was to see. Ross wished she could convey what she saw and felt so passionately about into something tangible, something that was personal in and of her.

In 2008, Ross's sister, who is also a visual artist, encouraged her to paint what she saw. Although Ross had never painted before, except for a few flowers on sweatshirts, and had taken no art courses, she bought a few brushes and then ... five years later she hasn't looked back. Her work has been displayed at Green Water Art Show in 2012 and at the recent Eastman Juried Art Exhibit. It can be seen and purchased at the new Pinawa Art 211 Gallery at Lewis Centre.

Ross uses vibrant acrylics. They suit her well as she paints with bold, strong strokes. She loves their immediacy as they dry quickly and they challenge her to stay in the moment and "just do." Ross likes to say that when she paints she becomes the birch leaf blowing in the wind, a gentle ripple on the river and the grass matted by a sleeping doe. She has become known as the "Birch Lady" with many of her birch paintings in homes throughout the region. Ross's husband passed away last November. She recalls him saying, "Valerie, the painting is done, it's beautiful, now step away." Ross has a hard time knowing when a painting

is finished. "It's like reading a book; you never want it to end."

For July, the Winnipeg River Arts Council features Janice Charko from Lac du Bonnet, an artist who creates and works with fibre. During her professional career, "creative" was not a word Charko would have used to define herself. She has a Bachelor of Commerce Degree and a CMA. With her husband, John Angus, she owned and managed a medical software company for 16 years, work which she has described as "very logical and inside the box!"

Then in 2008, at age 57, Charko was diagnosed with breast cancer. That year, rather than the usual winter in Florida, she and her husband spent the winter at their cottage while she received chemotherapy and radiation treatments. She lost her hair and hated wearing wigs so she started making hats that were fun – varied and colourful. When it was all over and her hair was finally making an appearance, she said she was done with cancer and done with hats.

Working with colours and various materials had resonated with Charko so she began to make things just for the prettiness of them. She moved from sea shell mirrors to beaded jewellery, needle felting, silk fusion and finally wet felting. She quickly realized that wool felting was her passion.

She loves to start with a soft mound of fluffy wool fleece and work it into felt. It takes hours of manipulating the hot soapy wool with her hands, rubbing and rolling, tossing and beating, all the while working it into the shape she wants. This year Charko began nuno felting wool onto silk chiffon scarves and shawls. Also, her silk fusion clutch purses have been popular, with the Starry Starry Night clutch winning first place in the fibre category at the 2013 Eastman Judged Art Exhibition.

Fire & Water Festival success!!!



WRAC FEATURED ARTIST FOR AUGUST: DON MACLELLAN

For August, the Winnipeg River Arts Council features Pine Falls musician, Don MacLellan. He has been playing guitar since the age of fourteen, for forty-five years.

When he started, he liked folk and other roots styles of music. Several other genres have influenced his musical interests but lately he has been bitten by the bluegrass bug and he has been exploring this style of guitar playing.

MacLellan has always played acoustic guitars. He likes the open chord "C-A-G-E-D" system, using capos to navigate to desired keys and using familiar chord shapes.

He prefers to arrange the songs of his favourite songwriters and performers to suit his playing style as opposed to writing his own original material. He is self-taught and plays by ear, although he admits, "I'm not always sure what those phrases mean."

MacLellan appreciates the opportunity to play with like-minded musicians. Although he insists "I don't perform regularly enough," he has entertained folks at weddings, benefit concerts, bars and events for seniors.

He likes to emulate performers such as JP Cormier, Joni Mitchell, Norman Blake, Gordon Lightfoot, Tony Rice, Nancy Griffith, Steve Goodman, and David Bromberg. He has taught his style of playing on the side, as well as on a volunteer basis at places such as Wings of Power. If asked, he will also repair and maintain guitars.

MacLellan is a councillor for Ward II with the town of Powerview-Pine Falls and, for the past three years, has helped establish and build the Winnipeg River Arts Council, serving as its President. He says, "I am proud of this rare opportunity to help entrench and promote the arts throughout our region, and it is an endeavour of which I am very proud."

The Winnipeg River Arts Council encourages other local musicians to join WRAC as members. The arts council can promote your talents in the region, if you want to perform or give lessons.



Irène Loire-Maillard

For October, Winnipeg River Arts Council features Pinawa artist Irène Loire-Maillard, a member of both WRAC and Pinawa ART 211. Her work has been exhibited often in Eastman region and she has been a student and practitioner of fine arts for many years (oil, acrylic and watercolour, drawing, clay sculpting, stone carving and photography).

She has studied in various cities across Canada and of late, Southern Spain. She was also privately tutored in stone carving by an Inuit carver in Nunavut.

Her paintings reflect a blend of science and art. She has travelled extensively and uses memories of colour, sounds and smells of various cultures. Currently her passion has led her to create abstract landscapes, using various techniques to create texture, form, colour, composition, layering and clean lines. Fascinated with the origins of the universe, she is in awe of the beauty of naturally sculpted forms.

She states, "Abstract art evokes thinking, feeling and seeing with one's own interpretation." This is what she strives to accomplish with her art.

Loire-Maillard's acrylic painting, "Influenced by Caravaggio," won the first prize at the *Eastman Judged Art Exhibition*, held in Pinawa during June of 2013. This piece was displayed, along with other award winning works from rural and Northern Manitoba, at *The 11th Annual Rural and Northern Art Show* (September 9 to October 6) held in the Pavilion Gallery Museum in Assiniboine Park, Winnipeg.

Loire-Maillard is interested in art forms of all kinds. She has lived and worked in Canada's Arctic where she collected many fine examples of local visual arts and carvings. For several years, she belonged to a creative writing group based in Pinawa. Also, her husband, Roger Dutton, is a long-time member and fervent supporter of the Pinawa Players so she sometimes gets persuaded to become involved in their ever-popular community theatre productions.



WRAC FEATURED ARTIST FOR AUGUST: BRIAN KNOCKAERT



For the month of November, Winnipeg River Arts Council features artist Brian Knockaert, a self-taught wood turner. Born and raised in St. Boniface, Manitoba, he moved to his cabin in St. Georges in 1998. He spent most of his working life in the steel industry and also worked at Pine Falls Hospital before retiring in 2008.

Knockaert combines his creative artistry and woodworking knowledge to create unique pieces. Over the years, he practiced his art and used various resources to build his skills; books, YouTube videos and internet research have been the most helpful.

His love of woodworking started with refinishing old furniture. This led to restoring old clocks and building his own. He began to carve birds, caricatures and walking sticks for family and friends.

After someone gave him an old lathe, he started to create pieces from the trees around him. Then he bought a bigger lathe from his brother and started to "play with turning wood." His wife, Donna-Rae, teases him that he has a lathe addiction. The larger lathe helps him craft more intricate creations, protecting the natural integrity of each piece.

Knockaert can look at the block of wood and see a finished piece. Local woods such as Manitoba maple, black and white ash, birch and willow are commonly used. Many friends and neighbours are always "on the lookout" for distinctive chunks of wood, which he crafts into works each with their own character, style and finish. Selling his creations was never his plan; this was a simple hobby of love and creativity to share with those he chose. But when family and friends started to ask to buy his objects, he started to sell them. It still surprises Brian when someone wants to purchase one of his works. The most interesting part of selling is where the pieces have gone - throughout Canada, the United States, Mexico, Switzerland and Australia.
